Two-year graduate program in the Department of Mathematics and Statistics. To graduate, you take 35 credits in four semesters; usually three courses per semester with 3 credits (3 classroom hours/week) including 4 credits for a final project or 10 credits for a thesis. You can use up to 14 UWB Magister level credits that will count as part of your 35 required credits.

We have 28 grad students, half of them international (6 UWB students recently). The department is very friendly with 17 tenured faculty members. UMD is among the top-ranked regional U.S. universities.

To apply, you need to do the following:

- TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) http://www.ets.org/toefl
- GRE General Test

- Submit your undergraduate transcripts
- Have three letters of recommendation submitted to us by your professors or instructors

Successful applicants will receive financial help, which means:

- Teaching Assistant job that pays about \$15,000 per year for teaching lower level math classes (calculus, precalculus, high school math) for 6 hours per week.
- FREE health insurance
